#### **LOOK OUT FOR**

Be very careful about taking on a builder who:

- Offers a worryingly cheap quote
- Is unwilling to provide a written quotation
- Is unwilling to provide names and numbers as references
- Will not put a stage payment plan in place
- Has imminent start dates available
- Requires a large deposit of more than 25%



#### **CHOOSING A BUILDER**

Get quotes from at least four builders. This will ensure you are getting a competitive quote, but remember choosing the cheapest is not always the best choice.

Ask for fixed quotes not estimates. Estimations are fine in the initial stages of planning, but ensure you have a fixed quote and a breakdown of costs before you sign a contract and work begins.

Make sure your fixed quotation covers all of the work needed and specific details such as materials, site clearance and time scales are included.

Always ask for a minimum of three references of previous customers they have carried out work for. A good builder should be able to give you references you can call and arrange a site visit where you can see recently completed work first hand.

## 10 TOP TIPS

- Draw up a work brief so you know what you want to achieve.
- 2. Ask how long the chosen builder has been trading and check if they have in-date Public Liability Insurance.
- 3. Draw up a contract to be signed before work starts.
- 4. Check what cover your builder has in case if insolvency.
- 5. Use a stage payment schedule.
  Only pay for work that has
  been carried out and that you
  are happy with and ensure
  Building Control have signed
  off each stage of the project.

- 6. Never agree to paying more than 25% of total build in cash up front.
- 7. Use an escrow service such as Transpact to provide monetary security for each payment stage.
- 8. Ask for a receipt for any payments made.
- 9. Communicate throughout ask for regular updates after each stage is complete and keep a diary of how the work is progressing.
- 10. Put aside a contingency fund of 10-15%.
